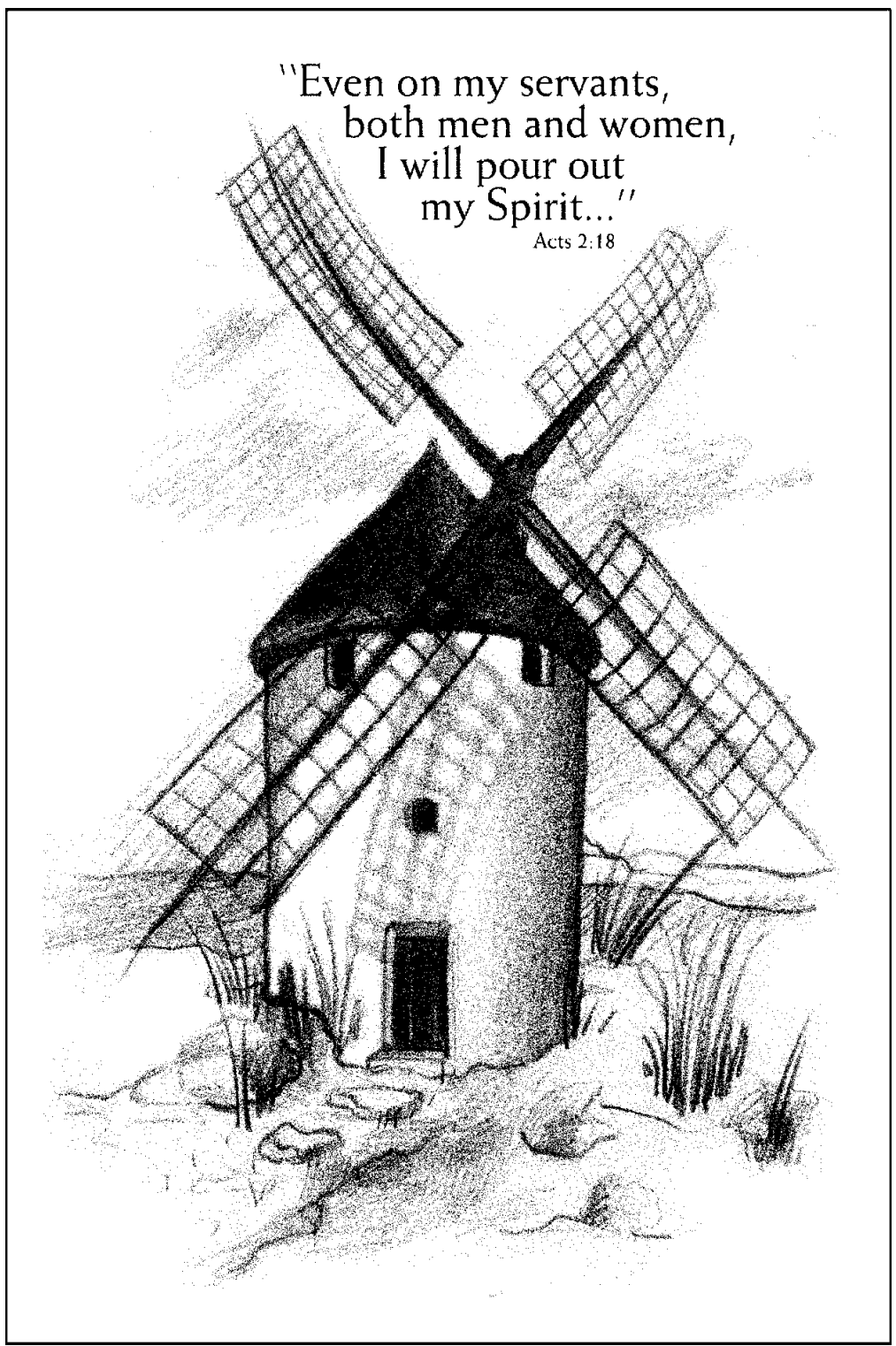

Baseball, basketball, football, track, soccer, cross country, I was even in a few plays. It was being a part of those that brought me the most joy. I still enjoy going out and playing basketball and working on my shot, but it no where compares to being apart of a team.
